What am I writing about? The 234 baptisms that have happened as a part of REACH.

As you may remember, two years ago we set out to help Fuel a Movement to Reach People and Renew Communities. In an effort to measure our progress, we set out several specific metrics - e.g., we tied our efforts to Renew Communities to a goal of 100,000 service hours outside the walls of the church.

The metric about reaching people was linked to the goal of seeing five hundred people get baptized. Of course baptism is not the ultimate goal. What we want to see is five hundred people make a new decision to follow Christ. But that can be hard to measure, so we said, "We want to see five hundred people get baptized."

And it's worth noting that 234 is not 500. Our work is not done. But 234 is a big number. Each one is a real life that has been impacted for eternity. Thank you for playing a part in this.

Thank you. You are making a difference.

For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all God's people, I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers.
